

Les Pook wall clock

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Figure 1 shows a Les Pook synchronous wall clock. The style is Art Deco. The stained glass case is 21 cm high \times 18 cm wide. The unglazed hexagonal dial is 21 cm high \times 18 cm wide. The hands, shown in Figure 2, are from a Sterling synchronous clock. Lead came between the stained glass panels acts as batons. The clock is fitted with a modern self starting synchronous movement, supplied by Cousins, and shown in Figure 2, which is a rear view. The movement is for a 230-240 V supply, and is marked 'Made in Germany' and 'Type 3'. The seconds hand acts as a tell tale. The clock was originally fitted with brass hands, supplied by Cousins, and shown in Figure 3.

The stained glass case was assembled using traditional techniques. Its appearance changes attractively with the lighting. It hangs on a white wall, and has been photographed to avoid reflections. The clock looks better in Figures 1 and 2, which were taken using flash, than in Figures 3 and 4, taken in natural light on an overcast day.

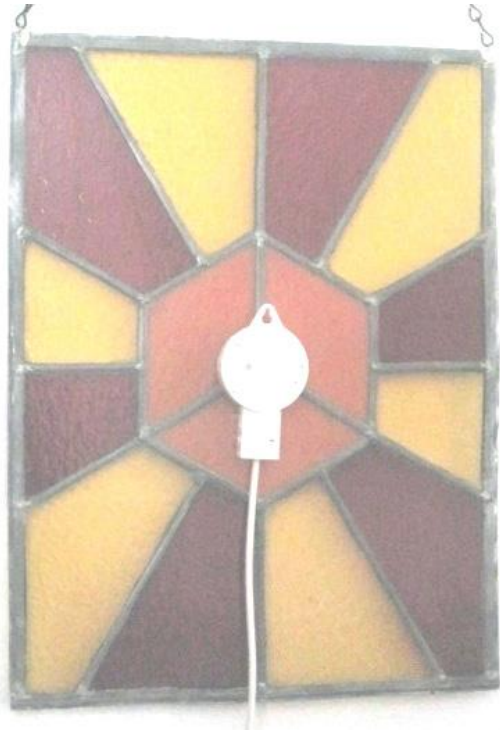

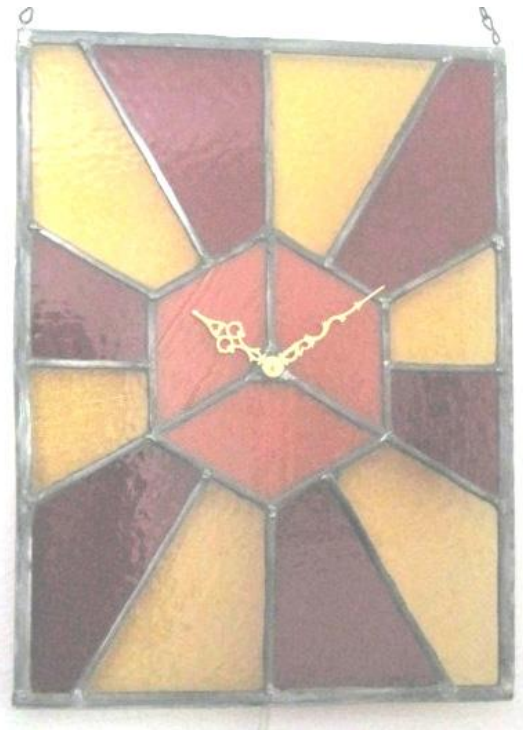
